GENERAL STATEMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Hearing Handicapped Resource Teacher shall be responsible for the identification of students with impaired hearing that interferes with regular classroom activities, and work with students and teachers to create a learning environment in which the hearing impaired student can function in an oral classroom setting.

MAJOR DUTIES:

1. Screen all incoming ninth grade students to identify students with potential hearing problems.
2. Communicate with the elementary school hearing resource teacher to coordinate a student's transfer to high school.
3. Obtain audiological documentation and signatures prior to the placement of the students in the Hearing Handicapped Resource Program.
4. Assist in the preparation of an Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) for each student enrolled in the Hearing Handicapped Resource Program.
5. Communicate with parents regarding the student's program and progress in school.
6. Confer with the regular classroom teacher regarding appropriate classroom modification for hearing impaired students; i.e., preferential seating, note takers, interpreters, and classroom buddies.
7. Confer with other resource teachers and speech and language pathologists regarding the student receiving dual services.
8. Apprise the Exceptional Student Programs Department Chairperson of the Program activities on the campus.
9. Communicate with community agencies which work with the hearing impaired.
10. Provide individual or group Hearing Resource classes as most appropriate for the student.
11. Teach all Hearing Resource classes, both credit and support: a. Hearing Lab - a class that meets for one hour per day; grades are given. b. Support - students meet with teachers on a scheduled basis at least one time per week. (No grade is given.)
12. Complete all paper work required by district, state and federal law.
13. Participate in Hearing Resource staffings and meetings.
14. Perform other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Possess Arizona Certification for Hearing Handicapped.
2. Have Bachelor's degree or Master's degree in Deaf Education.
3. Preferably, have two (2) years' experience with deaf/hearing impaired students.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED:

Department Chairperson of the Hearing Handicapped Resource Program and the Exceptional Student Programs Chairperson of their assigned school(s).

SUPERVISION GIVEN:

Supervise any student assistants and/or manual interpreter assigned to the program.
